Focused on reducing review times for qualifying permits, Launch45 supports faster project starts while maintaining compliance and quality standards. Expanded outreach efforts are helping customers better understand the permitting process, resulting in more complete applications and fewer review cycles

Ongoing enhancements to our permitting platform by improving workflow efficiency and consistency across departments.

▶ CUSTOMER SERVICE

Despite increasing demand, customer access metrics remained strong, with reduced wait times and consistent call response performance.

Your time is valuable. Our time to first service goal remains 10 minutes in our Solution Center.

On the phones, we aim to answer your calls timely and maintain a 60-74% answer rate even with over 800 calls per week. Got our voicemail? Leave a message. We WILL call you back. Trying to reach an inspector? Our inspector cell numbers are listed on the web.

▶ PLANS REVIEWS

There is no need for an expedite program when we are consistently turning plans in 10 days or less. Smaller projects are reviewed even faster.

▶ INSPECTIONS

The Department consistently delivers near real-time inspection services with completion rates averaging 99.5% completion by next business day.

We offer inspection services 24/7/365. Inspection requests before 7:00am or after 4:00pm incur a nominal fee. We're available to you.

› STAFFING

Year over year staffing stability has significantly improved and that means faster turnaround for you and more consistently delivery. Our Building Team is IAS Accredited and often scores amongst the highest in the region under the Building Code Effectiveness Grading schedule (BCEGS).

› COLLABORATION

The City hosted the South Florida EnerGov Users Group meeting in Fall 2025 and continues to serve as a regional leader in permitting innovation and collaboration. Sharing Best Practices with our colleagues across municipalities ensures we talk the same talk no matter where you go or what kind of project you are pursuing.

› ECONOMICS

Construction values are \$3.8-20M weekly. This means that development activity remains strong across mixed-use and commercial sectors. Additionally, private provider usage remains under 1%. You don't need another consultant on your team. You need your city to be an active and engaged partner and that's why we're here!

› RESILIENCY

Doral endeavors to focus actively not just on the hard skills and licensing initiatives but also on soft skills development like "emotional intelligence" and "conflict resolution". › STAFFING

FY26 Budget provided for a Licensing Outreach Coordinator to further develop the section's succession plan and ensure stable business license processing during peak times and to bridge gaps between divisions by having a powerhouse team member liaising with other departments.

› COLLABORATION

Ongoing partnership with multiple internal and external departments like Planning & Zoning, Code Compliance, Building, county, state and federal organizations.

In addition to enforcement, Code Compliance remains committed to community engagement and education, including:

- Coordinating the 8-week Mayor's Citizens Academy
- Attending HOA and community meetings
- Providing guidance to residents and businesses to encourage voluntary compliance

› RESPONSIVENESS

Through a balanced approach of enforcement, collaboration, and outreach, the Department continues to strengthen neighborhoods, support City operations, and remain accessible and responsive to the community.

› STAFFING

The department strengthened leadership and field capacity over the past six months:

- New Code Compliance Director promoted
- New Assistant Director promoted
- Two Code Compliance Officers hired
- New Code Compliance Technician hired
- These additions improved responsiveness and supported consistent service citywide.

› COLLABORATION

- 372 businesses addressed with expired BTRs and Certificates of Use
- 45 properties addressed through 30-year recertification efforts
- Ongoing partnership with Police to address recurring noise violations and support quality of life.

› RESILIENCY

The department remained steady, responsive, and proactive:

- Maintained uninterrupted operations during leadership transitions
- Continued prioritizing unpermitted work, business compliance, and noise violations
- Strengthened coordination across departments on complex cases
- Balanced enforcement with education and compliance assistance
