ITEM TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-322 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, APPROVING THE RENEWAL OF THE CITY'S CENTRALIZED DATA BACKUP STORAGE LICENSING, SUPPORT, AND ENTERPRISE SERVICES FROM UNITED DATA TECHNOLOGIES (UDT) VIA NASPO VALUEPOINT CLOUD SOLUTIONS AR2472 CONTRACT 43230000-NASPO-16-ACS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED BUDGETED FUNDS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXPEND FUNDS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY IN FURTHERANCE THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; PROVIDING FOR INCORPORATION OF RECITALS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

BRIEF HISTORY:

The Information Technology Department respectfully requests that the Mayor and City Council members approve the renewal of the city's centralized data backup storage licensing, support, and enterprise services from United Data Technologies (UDT), and the amount will not exceed budgeted funds.

On August 13, 2019, the Mayor and Council members approved Resolution No. 19-162, which authorized the City of Doral to implement a new data storage solution at our data center. This solution offers a secure and robust backup and recovery system.

The City currently maintains a secure backup and recovery solution that includes air-gapped, immutable, encrypted, and access-controlled data storage. The solution continuously monitors data risks, performs anomaly detection and threat monitoring, and protects against ransomware, cyber threats, administrative errors, and data loss while ensuring data is encrypted both in transit and at rest.

On January 15, 2025, the Mayor and Council members approved Resolution No. 25.04 to purchase an additional storage appliance to accommodate the City's data growth and increased demand, maintain business continuity, and meet the City's current and future data storage needs by duplicating the existing backup environment.

It's important to note that Section 119.0725 (b) of the Florida Statutes creates a public records exemption related to cybersecurity. Specifically, the statute makes confidential and exempt from public record requirements any information related to critical infrastructure.

Additionally, any portion of a meeting that might reveal such information is also exempt from public meeting requirements. See Section 119.0725(3), Florida Statutes.
