Mr. Garcia offers valuable expertise from his previous role with the City of Miami Beach, where he managed the design and construction of 87 stormwater pump stations and collaborated with multidisciplinary teams on critical infrastructure projects.

Resident & Water Resources & Hydraulic Engineer: Dr. Noemi Gonzalez Ramirez, PE

Dr. Gonzalez contributes over 15 years of specialized experience in hydrologic and hydraulic modeling, including development of flood risk maps for urbanized areas, flood control design, and coastal resilience projects, with particular expertise in FLO-2D modeling software.

#### Purpose

The purpose of the PPI (Program for Public Information) Committee is that it is a <u>requirement</u> for the Community Rating System (CRS) participation and to achieve a Class 4 Rating.

PPI Committee goals are:

- Identify priority areas of concern related to floods
- Assess flood insurance coverage
- Determine priority audiences and formulate public messaging campaigns and what outcomes we expect
- Identify outreach projects to convey messaging campaigns
- Examine other public information initiatives needed for CRS activities and adopt the program

The PPI Committee must be comprised of <u>both</u> city staff and non-governmental employees/stakeholders.

- Linda Blanco (Building Official/Floodplain Administrator)

Ad hoc members:

The non-governmental community stakeholders shall be members of the public, representatives of key community organizations or other agencies/organizations that can implement recommended outreach projects.

Examples of Resident or Business Owner having an interest in the city:

- HOA Board Member
- Emergency/Disaster Response First Responders (e.g. Red Cross, Salvation Army, etc.)
- Utility Company Representative
- Chamber of Commerce or another business-related outfit
- Engineering or Construction Trade Professionals

- **Insurance Agent** (\*Required for additional credit under CRS Activity 370)

## **Commitment**

- Minimum <u>3 external stakeholders</u>
- Monthly in-person or virtual meetings
- Quorum required
- Minimum 2-year term

The committee represents a diverse background of individuals passionate about floodplain management, protecting the health, safety and welfare of the Doral community and will be instrumental in the city's outreach efforts regarding floodplain management.
