



## CITY OF DORAL COUNCIL MEETING MEMORANDUM

### ITEM TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE PRIOR PURCHASE OF LICENSE PLATE READERS EQUIPMENT AND INSTALLATION FROM MILLENIUM PRODUCTS INC DUE TO AN UNFORESEEN EMERGENCY; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXPEND FUNDS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY IN FURTHERANCE THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; PROVIDING FOR INCORPORATION OF RECITALS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

### DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION:

### BRIEF HISTORY:

The City of Doral Information Technology Department received approval for an emergency purchase in accordance with the City's Municipal Code Section 2-321(2). The License Plate Readers (LPR) manufacturer has informed the City that some models are now at the end of life due to a newly identified security vulnerability. To ensure operational security, continuous system coverage, and support for public safety efforts, an urgent upgrade and replacement of these units is necessary. Delaying this purchase could expose the City to security threats and potential service interruptions.

We aim to continue working with the same contractor previously used for purchasing, deploying, and configuring LPR equipment. This vendor is already familiar with our current systems and infrastructure, enabling them to perform a quick and smooth replacement; and Their ongoing involvement will reduce downtime, ensure compatibility with existing components, and maintain continuity of public safety operations. Other vendors would not be able to provide the equipment or complete the configuration within the urgent timeframe.

The City Manager respectfully requests that City Council authorize the use of GSA Contract GS-07F-0031W for the prior purchase of the LPR equipment and installation, as required by the city, from Millenium Products in an amount not to exceed \$233,941.38.

It's important to note that Section 119.0725 (b) of the Florida Statutes creates a public records exemption related to cybersecurity. Specifically, the statute makes confidential and exempt from public record requirements any information related to critical infrastructure. Additionally, any portion of a meeting that might reveal such information is also exempt from public meeting requirements. See Section 119.0725(3), Florida Statutes.
